

Simplified Form example:

Revise the form attribute:

- Revise the id and name of “feedback” to whatever you wish that describes your form. Be sure the id and name are the same. Both attributes are used to maximize compatibility in older and newer browsers.

Add hidden fields (these are not viewable on the form):

- Edit the value “Feedback from Web Site” to whatever you wish to appear in the Subject heading of the email when the information arrives in your email box.

Revise input elements:

- Add f[] for each of the input elements as shown below. The PHP script will collect input from all the fields surrounded by the f[]. You do not need to revise the submit element.
- Below are three example input elements. You may add as many as you wish with the desired names and ids. Again, be sure the id and name are the same for each element. Both attributes are used to maximize compatibility in older and newer browsers.
